How Much Does it Cost To Cut a Tree Down in North Carolina?

Tree removal cost in North Carolina is usually a bit [below the national average](#). Here's a breakdown of what you can expect based on a tree's size:

Small Tree (Under 30 feet): \$150 - 515

Medium Tree (30-60 feet): \$400 - \$1310

Large Tree (60-80 feet): \$700 - \$2,800

Very Large (80+ feet): \$1000 - \$5000+

Most standard residential jobs in North Carolina land somewhere between a few hundred dollars and around \$2,000. The average homeowner often pays in the \$700 range for a typical medium tree.

In the Wilkesboro / Wilkes County area specifically, small-tree removals commonly fall in the \$480-\$610 range. These numbers will change based on other factors like your property conditions or the tree's health.

Key Factors That Affect Tree Removal Cost

Your tree's size is a major factor, but it's not the only one. Let's look at some of the most common factors that will affect your tree removal:

Tree size and height

Tall trees often require specialized equipment like buckets, cranes or even a man lift to safely remove sections before felling the tree. A 25-foot ornamental tree is a completely different job from a 70-foot oak.

Location and accessibility

Is the tree that needs to be removed right next to your house, squeezed between a fence and building, or near a powerline? Tight spaces require a little extra time and careful rigging before bringing the tree down – all of this can raise the price.

Tree condition and health

Dead trees, or diseased trees that are rotting from the inside can be unpredictable. They might need to be removed section by section.

Trees that have already fallen because of a storm, or are leaning in dangerous ways create more risk and require strategic work to remove.

These factors drive up the overall cost.

One time the Big Axe Tree Service Team removed a massively dangerous tree that was leaning over a house. We got the job done with multiple rigging lines and lots of careful work, but the extra tools and time involved ultimately influenced the cost.

Species and wood density

Hardwoods like oak, maple, or hickory are denser and take longer to cut and chip than softer pines or poplars.

Additional services like debris removal or stump grinding

Stump grinding, hauling away all the debris, or emergency after-hours work almost always add to the base removal price.

This is where you get to control the cost of your tree removal the most. While tree service companies normally offer everything from stump grinding to debris removal, you're the homeowner. You get to make the call whether you want to include those services.

If you choose to remove the debris or grind the stump yourself, a competitive tree removal service will adjust their quote to offer a lower price.

How to Get Affordable Tree Removal Quotes in Wilkesboro NC

You don't have to just accept the first number you're given. Here's what local homeowners can do to keep costs under control:

- Get at least three written quotes from insured, local companies.
- Ask exactly what's included (Cleanup? Hauling? Stump grinding?).
- Mention if you have multiple trees that can be done in one visit — many companies offer better pricing for volume.
- Provide clear photos (with a height reference if possible) when requesting estimates.
- Ask about off-season timing or flexible scheduling, which sometimes lowers the price.

- **Verify insurance and licensing.** The cheapest quote isn't a bargain if the crew isn't properly covered.

Extra Costs Homeowners Often Overlook

Even a solid base quote can grow once these items appear:

- **Stump grinding:** Usually \$100–\$500+ depending on diameter. Almost never included in the basic removal price.
- **Debris hauling:** Some companies leave the wood; others haul everything. Clarify this up front.
- **Emergency or storm work:** Can cost 20 to 30 percent more.
- **Permits:** Check with the Town of Wilkesboro or Wilkes County if your tree is large or in a regulated area. Regulated trees [require a permit](#) before removal. [Contact the town administrator](#) to obtain a permit and find out about any other conditions that may be involved.

Bottom Line for Wilkesboro Homeowners

The good news is that tree removal in Wilkesboro and Wilkes County is often more affordable than larger North Carolina metro areas. The final price you'll be quoted still depends on things like size, access and what services are included in the quote.
